Application period: 13 January – 1 March 2020, at 23:59 CET

Students can apply for a scholarship under the Cultural Agreements programme to attend a Danish Summer Language Course. The summer language course in Danish is open to bachelor's, master's and ph.d. students, who at the time of applying are enrolled in full-degree programmes in institutions of higher education in one of the following country groups:

Accepted students receive free tuition and a scholarship of 5,000 DKK as a supplement to cover meals and accommodation. Please note that students must cover all travel expenses and other personal expenses (Meals, shopping, gifts, etc.) by themselves.
